# OSHA Standards

- 29 CFR 1926.32(f)
  - “One who is capable of identifying existing and predictable hazards in the surroundings or working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous, or dangerous to employees, and who has authorization to take prompt corrective measures to eliminate them”





# OSSHA Standards (cont.)

- 29 CFR 1926.32(f)
  - Through training and/or experience, a competent person is knowledgeable of applicable standards, can identify workplace hazards relating to the specific operation and has the authority to correct them.
  - Some standards add additional specific requirements which must be met by the competent person



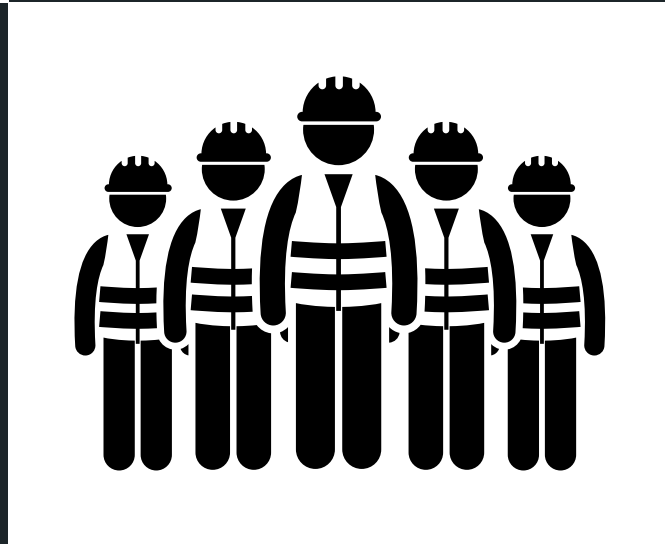


# SCS Standards

- To be considered a competent person with SCS, one must have the knowledge and experience to protect our employees in the workplace by
  - Identifying hazards
  - Performing inspections
  - Having the authorization from the employer to protect the employees until the hazards can be eliminated



# SCS Competent Person



- A competent person is typically affiliated with many areas in construction and excavation such as
  - Fall protection
  - Scaffolding
  - General jobsite electrical safety
  - Stairways and ladders
  - Confined space
  - Trenching and excavating
