

Safety Responsibility at Work

- SCS
 - Provides administrative and engineering controls and PPE
- Human Resources and Director of Construction
 - Ensures management is overseeing safety operations within their respective departments
- Supervisor
 - Enforces safety controls daily
- You
 - Learn the rules and follow them
 - Ask for clarification if necessary


Safety Attitude VS Unsafe Attitude

- Safe Attitude
 - Shows concern for others
 - Stays informed about safety
 - Participates in safety discussions
 - Follows safety rules and procedures
 - Identifies hazards
 - Stays healthy, fit, and focused
- Unsafe Attitude
 - Complacency
 - Does not participate in safety meetings, rushes through tasks
 - Carelessness
 - Does not wear proper PPE
 - Recklessness
 - Partaking in horseplay
- Fatigue
 - Causes mental errors which can jeopardize safety



THINK SAFETY

- Machine Operations
 - Before operating machinery, consider the hazards. Know your equipment before using, follow lockout/tagout procedures, perform maintenance only if authorized
- Material Handling
 - Consider your back, utilize material handling aids, evaluate the load and clear path, lift properly
- Working with chemicals
 - Consider the hazards, read the label or SDS, wear PPE, follow storage and handling procedures
- Housekeeping
 - Requires initiative and responsibility, prevents injuries, prevents fires, evacuation routes
- Emergency Preparedness
 - Familiarize yourself with work area, first aid and CPR
- Away from work
 - home projects, automobile safety, sports activities, safety officer for your children
- Meetings and Trainings
 - Learn safe operating and working procedures, ask questions or suggest additional training



TALK SAFETY

- Talk safety with your co-workers
 - Discuss safety hazards, provide safety suggestions, report hazards, initiate safety discussions
- Teach others
 - Teach others about safety hazards, PPE, safe operating procedures, stop unsafe acts
- At home
 - Discuss safety hazards, teach safe procedures, encourage safe behavior and use PPE, discuss emergency plans – does your family have an evacuation plan?



MODEL SAFETY

- Set an example
 - Wear proper PPE, inspect equipment, machinery, and chemical labels, follow safe operating procedures, understand workplace hazards, be involved with safety meetings, ask questions
- Encourage safe behavior
 - compliment others for following safe working procedures and wearing proper PPE, put a stop to horseplay, speak up! Tell management about unsafe conditions, procedures, or acts.
- Health and fitness
 - Get plenty of sleep, eat nutritious meals, stretch and exercise, manage stress, avoid drugs and alcohol
